1. Summary

1.1 This report provides details of planned or ongoing scrutiny work by the Transport Committee and the schedule of Committee meetings for the 2015/16 Assembly year.

2. Recommendations

3. Background

3.1 The Committee receives a report monitoring the progress of its work programme at each meeting.

4. Issues for Consideration

- 4.1 Members have agreed a number of priorities for the Committee's work programme in 2015/16. The following is a list of topics that the Committee will aim to explore, including new topics and follow-up to previous work.
 - Rail services;
 - Commercial traffic;
 - Weekend and night-time travel;
 - Motorcycle safety;
 - Accessibility;
 - Coaches;
 - Cycling;
 - Crossrail;
 - Red routes; and
 - Taxi and private hire services.

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4.2 The exact scope and timings for work on any of these other possible topics will be determined in due course and more detailed work programme reports submitted to future meetings. The Committee seeks to maintain flexibility in its work programme to take account of any relevant developments when scheduling its work and has a rolling work programme so work on any topics may continue beyond each Assembly year.

Rail services

4.3 The Committee has launched an investigation into National Rail services, focusing on the case for devolution to London. Representatives from Transport for London and the Mayor's Office have been invited to attend this meeting. Further detail is included under another item on this agenda.

Taxi and private hire

4.4 The Committee's report into taxi and private hire services was published in December 2014.

Follow-up work on this topic is being undertaken. Representatives from Transport for London have been invited to attend this meeting. Further detail is included under another item on this agenda.

Commercial traffic

4.5 On 9 June 2015, the Committee delegated authority to the Chair in consultation with party Group Lead Members to determine the scope and terms of reference of an investigation into commercial traffic in London. It is likely this investigation will examine recent trends in commercial traffic volume on London streets and consider steps Transport for London (TfL) can take to manage these. Members are currently considering a proposal for the scope and terms of reference drawn up by Committee officers. It is anticipated that the Committee will invite experts and stakeholders to its next meeting on 9 September to discuss this topic, and also on 15 October.

Motorcycle safety

4.6 The Committee has made motorcycle safety one of its priority topics for 2015/16. It is anticipated that the Committee's meeting on 10 November will be used to discuss this topic. Further details on the work will be provided at a subsequent meeting.
