Introduction



This information is from The Liberty Advisory Group.

We are in charge of planning Liberty, which is an event put on by the Mayor of London.



The event celebrates **D/deaf**, disabled and **neurodiverse** artists.



D/deaf has 2 meanings:

- Capital D Deaf means people who have no hearing.
- d deaf means people who have some hearing loss.



Neurodiverse means people whose brains work differently.

About Liberty



Liberty started in 2003.



Since then the event has used different ways to show off artists' work in the outdoors.



In 2018, Liberty was an event that moved around to different places.



In 2019, the Mayor decided to make Liberty part of London Borough of Culture.



London Borough of Culture is an award that gives an area of London money to spend on **the arts**.



The arts means things like:

theatre



music



writing – like books, stories or poems



crafts – like sewing or knitting



 art – like painting or making things out of clay



performance – like dancing or singing.



Liberty hasn't happened in 2020 because of **COVID-19**.



COVID-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and breathing.



We are not sure what will happen with Liberty in 2021. We will try and put on some events.



But we are making plans to go ahead in 2022 and 2023.

What the Liberty Advisory Group does



The Liberty Advisory Group:

 helps decide what will happen at Liberty



 gives advice on how to work with and talk to D/deaf and disabled people



Advice is about helping you understand or telling you how to do something.



helps to advertise Liberty

Advertise is to let people know about something – like on posters or TV.



gives advice on how Liberty should work



 suggests what should happen if anything goes wrong



 tries to make Liberty better and solve any problems



goes to 4 meetings a year



will go to Liberty in 2021 and 2022



 will think about what is best for the future of Liberty.

What members need to be good at



You need to have **experience** of working with and talking to D/deaf and disabled people.

Experience is when you have done something before.



We would like to hear from you if you are good at:

putting on accessible outdoor events

Accessible means places are easy to get into or around. Especially for disabled people.



working with D/deaf and disabled artists



 advertising that is good for D/deaf and disabled people



 getting the community to join in, especially on the internet

A **community** is a group of people living in the same area.



making things accessible and inclusive

Inclusive means everybody can do it.



putting on inclusive events online.

Online means via the internet so that people can do it on their computers or phones.

Being a member



There is a 2 hour meeting once every 2 months.



This will happen online or in an accessible place.



If you spend money on things like travel, you can get it back.



We will make sure our meetings are inclusive and accessible.



Meetings start in February 2021. We will talk about the dates of other meetings with the members.
