### **Agenda Item 1: Notes of the last meeting and Actions**

The Board notes of 24 October 2019 were agreed. There were no outstanding actions.

### **Agenda Item 2: Violence Update**

MOPAC, the VRU and the MPS updated the Board. MOPAC updated on funding for youth services and gang exit work. The VRU provided information on its work including measures to tackle school exclusions, provide after-school provision and work with pupil referral units. The MPS provided statistical analysis of violent crime including reductions in knife crime with injury in under-25s and the discharge of firearms. The MPS were focusing on violence hotspots, gangs and county lines activity.

#### County Lines

London Councils updated the board on local authority work to combat county lines gangs. This included research and awareness raising, a pan-London rescue and response project and a local approach to violence and vulnerability at L.B. Lewisham. London Councils hosted a pan-London County Lines Summit and have collated best practice into an online hub.

### **Agenda Item 3: Disproportionality and race equality in the Criminal Justice System**

The Board considered the work that was being undertaken by partners to counter disproportionality in the CJ System improve trust and confidence. This included the Youth Disproportionality Action Plan, the VRU strategy for victims and work to improve the use of out of court disposals. The Board agreed that disproportionality would be a standing item at future meetings that partners will report against.

### **Agenda Item 4: Violence Against Women and Girls**

An update was provided on the Sexual Abuse Referral Centre (SARC) Review. The aim of this was to redesign and improve the SARC operating model and facilities based on current demand and needs. The Board was also updated on the VAWG Systems review by Moorhouse and Supporting Justice for tackling VAWG. The review will deliver three key products: a scoping study to inform the development of key design principles; a review of the current victims journey and recommendations to form the basis of a target operating model and a framework for services.

### **Agenda Item 5: Police and Crime Plan Update**

There was a very short update on progress completion of the current the Police and Crime Plan (PCP) actions. The timetable for the drafting and consultation for the next PCP following the mayoral election was discussed.

### **Agenda Item 5: Any other business**

The LCRB Chair, Mayor Sadiq Khan thanked the outgoing Board members from the Crown Prosecution Service for their contribution to the Board's work.
