1. Welcome and Introductions

MOPAC welcomed the attendees to the RRB.

Actions from previous meeting and progress made on discussions were covered.

2. Performance Data and Updates

Developing a view of sufficiency

MOPAC asked the group: Do we know about the sufficiency of services in London? How do we gain a better view? The group highlighted that it depends what our outcomes are and what we define 'sufficiency' as. There are differences between considering needs being met and the quality of service provision. Each organisation would define this differently and will monitor this in different ways.

MOPAC posed the question: is service mapping needed to see where there are gaps and to avoid overlapping of services? There was a shared view that partners do not have clear service mapping currently in place for their organisations services so to do this would be resource heavy.

Provider forum

A draft proposal for the introduction of a Provider Forum was circulated in advance of the meeting. Overall, the group agreed with this proposal.

A few aspects need to be looked at in more detail and an updated proposal will be presented to the group:

- How do we attract the correct voluntary and community sector (VCS) organisations?
- Partner good practice
- Seniority level
- Forum & network mapping

3. Disproportionality

Workforce and caseload data

Following the last two LCRB meetings, the Mayor gave DMPC an action to write to partners to request caseload and workforce entincity data to see how representative they are. This board is going to be the forum for discussion.

MOPAC spoke through slides which presented workforce data compared with both caseload data and the wider London population, for additional context as we know that caseloads themselves are in many cases disproportionate. Overall, the majority of CJC organisations who provided us with data have workloads fairly representative of their caseload.

In future meetings, organisations will present what they are doing to improve representativeness within their organisation.

The need to develop a disproportionality action plan for adults (as well as young people which is already underway) was raised at the LCRB. There is potential for the introduction of a disproportionality sub-board.

4. Persistent Offenders

NPS presented slides on the new IOM framework.

Links were drawn to the provider forum and the possibility of drawing in local panels.

Any further strategic blockages or relationship issues with pathways should come back to the board to be discussed. RRB could support to unblock these issues.

5. Transitions and Young Adults

MOPAC presented slides on the Shared Outcomes Fund bid and transitions pilot model.

6. Probation Update

NPS presented slides on the probation redesign work.
