The Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, and the Chair of London Councils, Cllr Georgia Gould, will be hosting the 'London Greener and Warmer Homes and Workplaces Summit' on Tuesday 22 February 2022.

This event will gather people responsible for greening London's existing buildings, from domestic, commercial and public sectors. It will inspire action and enable collaboration to achieve a rapid acceleration of building improvements across the city, at an ever-greater scale.

The Summit will take place online, with a public hour from 10-11am to inspire and motivate participants to take action. Sadiq Khan and Cllr Gould will personally host this hour, which will give practical illustrations of what the public sector and its partners are doing.

Pathways to net zero by 2030

In the face of the growing climate crisis, we must accelerate our drive towards decarbonising buildings across London.

The Mayor has set a target for London to be net zero carbon by 2030. To support this ambition, he commissioned experts Element Energy to analyse the possible pathways to achieving net zero.

The Mayor has selected a preferred pathway to net zero – the Accelerated Green pathway. You can read more about this route and the Mayor's response in the full report available on the GLA's website.

You can also download <u>London's Zero Carbon Pathways Tool</u>, which shows four ways that carbon emissions might be reduced to net zero by 2030. Modelling has been done on a pan-London basis, so borough level results are an estimate only.
