

# Roads Task Force Terms of Reference and Membership

## Purpose

Roads are vital to the Capital's economy and to movement around the city; roughly 80% of all passenger trips and many freight trips in London are made by road.

However London's roads face a number of challenges in the short, medium and long term. These challenges include conflicts between competing users, accommodating population and employment growth, rising expectations for high quality public space and the imperative to improve road safety.

To meet these challenges, London needs a long-term strategy for the development, design and management of its road network to ensure it is fit for the 21st century.

To help develop this strategy, the Mayor has established a Roads Task Force. The Task Force will:

- Be made up of individuals who represent the key road user interests and/or have expertise or experience that can help advise the Mayor and TfL on the future development of London's road network;
- Meet over a period of several months to consider and debate the key issues and challenges facing London's road network in the short-, medium- and long-term;
- Contribute to the development of a report advising the Mayor on the design, management and operational options for London's roads and their funding.

It is essential London's road network supports sustainable social and economic growth and all the Mayor's strategies. It must be one which is more reliable, no more congested than it is today (and ideally less congested), safer, cleaner, healthier, better serves local communities, and contributes positively to the urban realm.

A re-invigorated, integrated approach is needed to achieve this vision.

The Mayor has asked for this vision to be developed by the Roads Task Force.

## Membership

- Greater London Authority (GLA) chairperson, stakeholders (See appendix A for list of members)

## Deliverables

- To contribute and act as a sounding board for a report to the Mayor. setting out short, medium and long term proposals for the London's roads
- An interim report will be prepared by November 2012 and used to inform the Mayor's London 2020 Vision report
- A final report will be prepared in Spring 2013

- Series of meetings to gather and review evidence, provide feedback and agree advice to be given on the development of the interim and final reports.
