Coming into force - 24th November 2016

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 59, 60, 61 and 333(7) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990(a), makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

 This Order may be cited as the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 2016 and comes into force on 24th November 2016.




2.—(1) The Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015(b) is amended as follows.




Rooftop Installations















Various Rooftop Solutions





Cornerstone Streetworks Monopole Installation








