Caveats

The underlying Single Housing Benefit Extract (SHBE) reflects Local Authority data. Supported Accommodation (SA) cases identified in SHBE do not align with published statistics. We are aware that there is some under reporting of Specified Accommodation claims on SHBE which will affect the Specified Exempt classification used in this FOI.

Hence, we would advise caution in comparing caseload trends over time as any changes in under reporting could be interpreted as a change in trend.

For the supported housing statistics we have used 'ccspecified' which is a flag set by LAs for claimants in specified exempt or non exempt accommodation.

Claims are determined to be on the caseload for a given month if they were a live claim as of the second Thursday of the month. This is the same as the definition used on DWP's statistical tool Stat Xplore.

The figures supplied are derived from unpublished information and have not been quality assured to Official Statistics publication standard. They should therefore be treated with caution.

The most recent data held on SHBE is November 2021. The splits therefore refer to data from November 2021.

We are refusing this part of your request under section 12, because we estimate that compliance with your request will exceed the "appropriate limit" under section 12. The appropriate limit is £450 which is equivalent to 18 hours at £25 per hour. The per hour figure is set by Regulation rather than actual salary paid to any officers handling requests. The appropriate limit includes the time it will take the council to discover if it holds the information requested, to locate it, extract it and collate it as well as putting it into any particular format requested by the requester. We have calculated that it will take approximately 91.5 hours to comply with this part of your request. Our calculation is as follows: I have checked with our System support team and this Information is only available via the monthly Single Housing Benefit Extract (SHBE) return sent to the Department for Work and Pensions. It takes 30 minutes to load each monthly extract, filter exempt accommodation cases, and store the modified report. As SHBE extract data is recorded monthly, reports for the same financial year would need to be matched against each other and duplicates manually removed to ensure individual claims are only recorded once. It is estimated this would take a further 20 minutes per report, taking the total to 55 minutes per report. Further to this, SHBE data is only held on our systems for 12 months. After this time reports are passed to archive. To retrieve the reports from Archive would take an additional 15 minutes per report, taking the total for archived reports to 70 minutes. From April 2016, there are 81 SHBE extracts that would require checking, 12 are available on our systems to download, and 69 would need to be retrieved from archive. Therefore it is estimated it would take 91.5 hours to provide the information as below: Reports not in archive: 12×55 minutes / 60 = 11 hours. Reports in archive : 69×70 minutes / 60 = 80.5 hours. Advice and Assistance We could provide the information requested in a) over a shorter period. It is estimated the maximum period within the time constraints would be 18 months.

Based on an estimate of 2 minutes to check each case, it would take at least 100 hours of staff time to extract the data requested. This would exceed the threshold of 18 hours set out under the FOIA. We are also unable to supply this information for those claims identified in the snapshot at the start of April 2022, because we would need to check all 365 claims, and to do so would exceed the FOI appropriate limit, as specified in the Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004; therefore Section 12(1) of the Act applies. The appropriate limit has been set at £450 and may include working hours of any person acting on our behalf at a rate of £25 per hour. This equates to 18 hours to locate and extract the relevant information. To comply with your request would take in excess of 18 hours as the information is not held in a readily extractable format and would require a manual undertaking to review approximately 365 claim records. Even at a conservative estimate of 10 minutes per case file, it would take in excess of 60 hours to identify, locate, retrieve and extract the relevant information. This significantly exceeds the appropriate limit under the Act.
