This support could include greater pastoral care, additional tailored support, employment coaching, and other delivery that 'wraps' around learning and addresses the challenges many learners with lower level skills face in progressing in education and training. This funding uplift also recognises the rising costs of delivery for skills training incurred by providers in London. The ESFA is in the process of refreshing the national funding rates in time for the 2024-25 academic year. Mayoral Skills Academies	academic year. An Academy job outcome is defined as a job entry of a learner who was either not in employment and/or outside benefit arrangements or was in work that did not meet the definition of good work upon their enrolment to an adult skills funded (Funding Model 35) learning aim, to a job which relates to a priority sector, is a minimum of 16 hours/week and is expected to last at least four consecutive weeks.
