# Skills for Londoners Community Outreach Programme

Webinar – 11 June 2024

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### BACKGROUND

The Mayor is responsible for the majority of adult skills in London through different programmes, however, many Londoners have a limited awareness of the adult skills opportunities available. Evidence shows that community groups and local organisations are highly valued and trusted by the Londoners and neighbourhoods they work with, and, as such, can be more effective at reaching people and connecting them to opportunities.

The Community Outreach Programme has funded community organisations over the past two years to raise awareness of London's adult skills opportunities, increase participation in adult learning skills provision, and help to build sustainable links between providers, community groups and the Londoners they work with:

- In 22/23 we worked with 12 different community groups across a range of target groups.
- In 23/24 we expanded the programme and funding available to work with 28 organisations across all London boroughs.

The Mayor is now launching the third round to continue this work with community groups and the Londoners you work with.

#### **PROGRAMME OVERVIEW**

Grants of up to £35,000

For to up to 45 community organisations

Projects can work across any London boroughs

To engage with Londoners who have barriers to engaging with adult skills provision

Programme will run from September 2024 – August 2025

Initially, this is a one-year programme to run to August 2025 with a possibility for additional funding into a further year for projects that are successfully delivering. This is subject to available GLA funding at the time.

Application window is open between 17 May 2024 to 5pm 21 June 2024.

# **OBJECTIVES**

The Skills for Londoners Community Outreach Programme aims to engage groups of Londoners who are currently not enrolled in adult skills by:



The programme has a specific focus on raising awareness of numeracy skills and provision, such as the London Multiply programme.

# **TARGET GROUPS**

The programme aims to engage individuals who are most in need of support. Examples of target groups which previous funded community outreach programme projects have worked with are below, but bidders are welcome to outline additional target groups to the ones below through their application form.

- Individuals who are digitally excluded and or who have had negative experiences of mainstream education Black or minoritised ethnic Londoners
- Women
- Individuals with English language needs
- Individuals seeking asylum
- Individuals who are out of work or Londoners earning below the London living wage
- Deaf, disabled and neurodivergent Londoners, and those with long-term health conditions
- Parents and those with caring responsibilities
- Care leavers
- Ex-offenders
- Those with experience of the criminal justice system

Bidders should demonstrate existing connections with their target groups or an ability to develop new connections with the groups they will work with through their application.

## **ORGANISATION ELIGIBILITY**

#### To be eligible to apply for funding on this programme, organisations must:

- Be a user-led London-based community, voluntary, faith, cultural, or grassroots organisation.
- Be a registered charity, social enterprise or Community Interest Company that can demonstrate a track record of transparent financial accounting processes.
- Have an annual income under £500,000.
- Hold a UK bank account.
- Be an individual or un-constituted community group nominating a partner organisation to receive the funds on their behalf.

# **PROGRAMME ACTIVITY**

# Bidding organisations will be able to apply for funding to deliver a range of engagement activities that will help to achieve the overall programme objectives.

#### Programme activity should include:

• Targeted support to promote and raise awareness of adult skills opportunities and generate referrals into learning.

• Establishing referral pathways into adult skills by building and strengthening relationships between community groups and key organisations such as adult learning providers, No Wrong Door Integration Hubs, or other support agencies who can help address barriers to learning.

• Reducing negative perceptions of maths by promoting and raising awareness of the role of numeracy skills to everyday life and work and numeracy learning opportunities.

• Supporting participants when they start an adult skills opportunity where needed, to help overcome any initial challenges and reduce the risk of drop-out.

• Working closely with participants to provide support that builds confidence, and helps access local services (such as childcare, health and social care and other specialist services), so that they may be able to participate in adult skills.

• Working closely with other skills community engagement programmes such as the London Multiply Roadshow.

• Signposting to adult community learning provision.



## **PAYMENT MODEL**

Subject to the delivery of key claim requirements as outlined in the Delivery Handbook (draft), successful projects will be paid in milestone payments as set out below:

# **MAYOR OF LONDON FUNDED SKILLS PROVISION**

Adult skills provision is funded by the Mayor in London and delivered through a number of different programmes. Successful grantees should work with their target groups to encourage participation into the best type of adult skills provision for their needs. In London this provision currently includes:

- The Adult Skills Fund (ASF), previously the Adult Education Budget, funds education and training for adults 19 and above, Some of these qualifications include basic English and maths skills, basic digital and ESOL.
- The London Multiply Programme offers free training to support Londoners to get the numeracy, confidence and skills they need to manage everyday living at work and home.
- Skills Bootcamps aim to help Londoners aged 19 and above to enter employment, upskill or change career.
  Bootcamps last up to 16 weeks and focus on higher level training (Level 3 5) in key sectors.
- The Mayor's Skills Academies Programme aims to support Londoners hardest hit by the pandemic into good work in sectors key to London's recovery and long-term economic growth. The hubs work with existing skills providers funded through the ASF, and bring together employers, education and training providers, alongside sector bodies to create clear pathways into employment for Londoners.
- The **UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF)** aims to reduce the barriers some people face to employment and focuses on two target groups: supporting young people and economically inactive and unemployed Londoners.
- Free courses for jobs (FCFJ) offers access to a level 3 qualification and support Londoners to gain skills to help them progress into employment.

### **DELIVERY HANDBOOK**
