 - London Ambulance Service NHS Trust, who are recruiting apprentices to address workforce shortages and develop a diverse pipeline of skilled paramedics.

Awards will be given across ten categories, recognising learners, providers, inspirational tutors and non-teaching staff, as well as employers and community organisations that support adults into skills opportunities.

Categories include Inspirational Adult Learner of the Year, Learning for Good Work Employer of the Year, and Distinguished Provider of Adult Education.

Last year's winners include a tutor who fled Ukraine and worked to help other Ukrainian refugees to settle in the UK, a coffee shop that trains young disabled people to be baristas, giving them skills for work and life, and the London Ambulance Service NHS Trust, who are recruiting apprentices to address workforce shortages and develop a diverse pipeline of skilled paramedics.

Award Categories

Londoners, learning providers, employers and community or training organisations are invited to make nominations across the ten award categories.

We want to ensure that nominations reflect London's diversity and we welcome nominations from everyone regardless of age, gender or gender identity, gender expression, ethnicity, sexual orientation, faith or disability.

1. Inspirational Adult Learner of the Year Award Inspirational achievement or commitment to learning and progression in life or work.

2. Learning for Personal Progression Award

For exceptional personal progression as a result of learning, including personal development and non-employment outcomes, including overcoming barriers or challenges faced personally. This could include improvements to health and wellbeing; social integration; learner self-belief and/or participation in volunteering.

3. Learning for Good Work Award

For exceptional progression into employment and in-work progression as a result of further education and training. Including overcoming barriers or challenges faced in entering work.

4. Distinguished Provider of Adult Education Award

For demonstrating commitment to learners, tutors and the communities in which they serve.

Providers who meet or are working towards the Mayor's Good Work standard, are inclusive and represent the communities they serve, including providers who are fulfilling their commitments as Anchor institutions in their communities, i.e. setting out plans to achieve net zero carbon estates by 2030.

Providers that have achieved or are working towards a Mayor's Skills Academies Programme Quality Mark are particularly encouraged to apply.

5. Inclusive Provider of Adult Education Award

For going above and beyond to demonstrate inclusive teaching accommodations for their learners, including providing exceptional support to learners with additional language or educational needs.

6. Learning for Good Work Employer of the Year Award

For going above and beyond to help Londoners get into good work. Employers who have supported training or development programmes to support employees and/or new entrants into their organisation to acquire skills or support progression.

Employers must be offering Good Work, including paying London Living Wage, to be eligible.

7. Apprenticeship Employer of the Year Award

For going above and beyond to help Londoners get into high-quality apprenticeships and supporting them throughout.

Employers must be offering Good Work, including paying London Living Wage, to be eligible.

8. Outreach and Engagement of Adults into Learning Award

For outstanding commitment to supporting Londoners into adult learning opportunities, to gain the skills they need for life, work and progression into good work.

9. Inspirational Tutor of the Year in Adult Education Award

Going above and beyond to provide high-quality education and support to Londoners, inspiring them to overcome barriers and gain the skills they need to make positive progress in life and work.

10. Inspirational Professional in Adult Education Award

Going above and beyond to provide high-quality education and support to Londoners, by non-teaching staff at an adult education provider.

- Winners selected by September 2024
- Winners and their nominators will be notified in September 2024
- Nominators of non-winners will be notified in October 2024
- Winners will be announced in October/November 2024
