

## Statement of Intent for ECO4

### Greater London Authority ECO4 Flexible Eligibility Statement of Intent

This statement sets out Greater London Authority's flexible eligibility criteria for the Energy Company Obligation (ECO4) scheme from April 2022 – March 2026.

The ECO4 scheme will focus on supporting low income and vulnerable households. The scheme will improve the least energy efficient homes helping to meet the Government's fuel poverty and net zero commitments.

The flexible approach for Local Authorities (LAs) to identifying fuel poor and vulnerable households who may benefit from heating and energy saving measures is referred to as "ECO4 Flex".

The authority welcomes the introduction of the ECO4 Flex eligibility routes as it helps the authority achieve its plans to improve the homes of those in fuel poverty or vulnerable to the cold.

The authority is publishing this Statement of Intent (SoI), on the **25/01/2023** to confirm that each of the households declared will adhere to at least one of the four available routes outlined below:

**Route 1:** SAP bands D-G households with an income less than £31,000. This cap applies irrespective of the property size, composition, or region.

**Route 2:** SAP bands E-G households that meet a combination of two of the following proxies:

<b>Proxy 1)</b> Homes in London in Lower-layer Super Output Area 1-3 (LSOA) <sup>1</sup>
<b>Proxy 2)</b> Householders receiving a Council Tax reduction (based on low income only).
<b>Proxy 3)</b> Householders vulnerable to living in a cold home as identified in the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) Guidance. Only one from the list can be used, excludes the proxy 'low income'.
<b>Proxy 4)</b> A householder receiving free school meals due to low-income.
<b>Proxy 5)</b> A householder supported by an authority run scheme, that has been named and described by the authority as supporting low income and vulnerable households for the purposes of NICE Guideline.  <i>Details of scheme: Mayor of London's Warmer Homes programme, providing insulation, heating, and renewable energy improvements to the homes of Londoners who are owner occupiers or private tenants and low income or vulnerable to the cold.</i>
<b>Proxy 6)</b> A household referred to the authority for support by their energy supplier or Citizen's Advice because they have been identified as struggling to pay their electricity and gas bills.

\* Note proxies 1 and 3 cannot be used together.

**Route 3:** SAP bands D-G households that have been identified by their doctor or GP as low-income and vulnerable, with an occupant whose health conditions may be impacted further by living in a cold home. These health conditions may be cardiovascular, respiratory, immunosuppressed, or limited mobility related.

This is because the authority has identified a positive correlation between households who suffer from long-term health conditions and living off a low-income, with living in poorly insulated homes.

**Route 4:** SAP band D-G households that are referred under Route 4: Bespoke Targeting. Suppliers and LAs can submit an application to BEIS where they have identified a low income and vulnerable household, who are not already eligible under the exiting routes.

All potentially eligible households should apply through **Greater London Authority** or one of their approved ECO installers to ensure that they can either benefit from the scheme or be assessed for eligibility under any other relevant programme.
