

WHAT DID THE MAYOR ANNOUNCE?

- The Mayor announced an historic £130m emergency, one-off funding plan to help families with the spiralling cost of living by expanding London's free school meals offer, ensuring that primary school children in London will receive free school meals in the 2023/24 academic year. Rollout will take place in September 2023.
- This funding will help up to 270,000 primary school children in the capital receive free school meals and could save families around £440 across the year.
- This is emergency funding and he will continue to call on Government to step forward and provide the funding to make this permanent.



WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF UNIVERSAL FSM?

Extending free school meals to children who do not currently receive it, potentially saves families up to £440 per academic year.

In a review of UIFSM, students receiving FSM 4-8 weeks' more progress in Maths and English than similar pupils in comparison areas. Improvements in attainment were strongest for pupils from less affluent families.

Research from CPAG suggests that making FSM universal helps reduce stigma and boosts take up among families who need them most.

Food insecurity affects **children's wellbeing**, with children from families experiencing food insecurity more likely to suffer from mental health problems and disorders.

In a study of the impact of UFSM in 4 London boroughs, receiving UFSM reduced prevalence of **obesity by 9.3 per cent** among Reception children and 5.6 per cent among Year 6 children on average.

Economies of scale can make large savings. When Islington introduced universal FSM, it retendered its catering contract on a joint contract with Camden, which saved them £1m per year.
