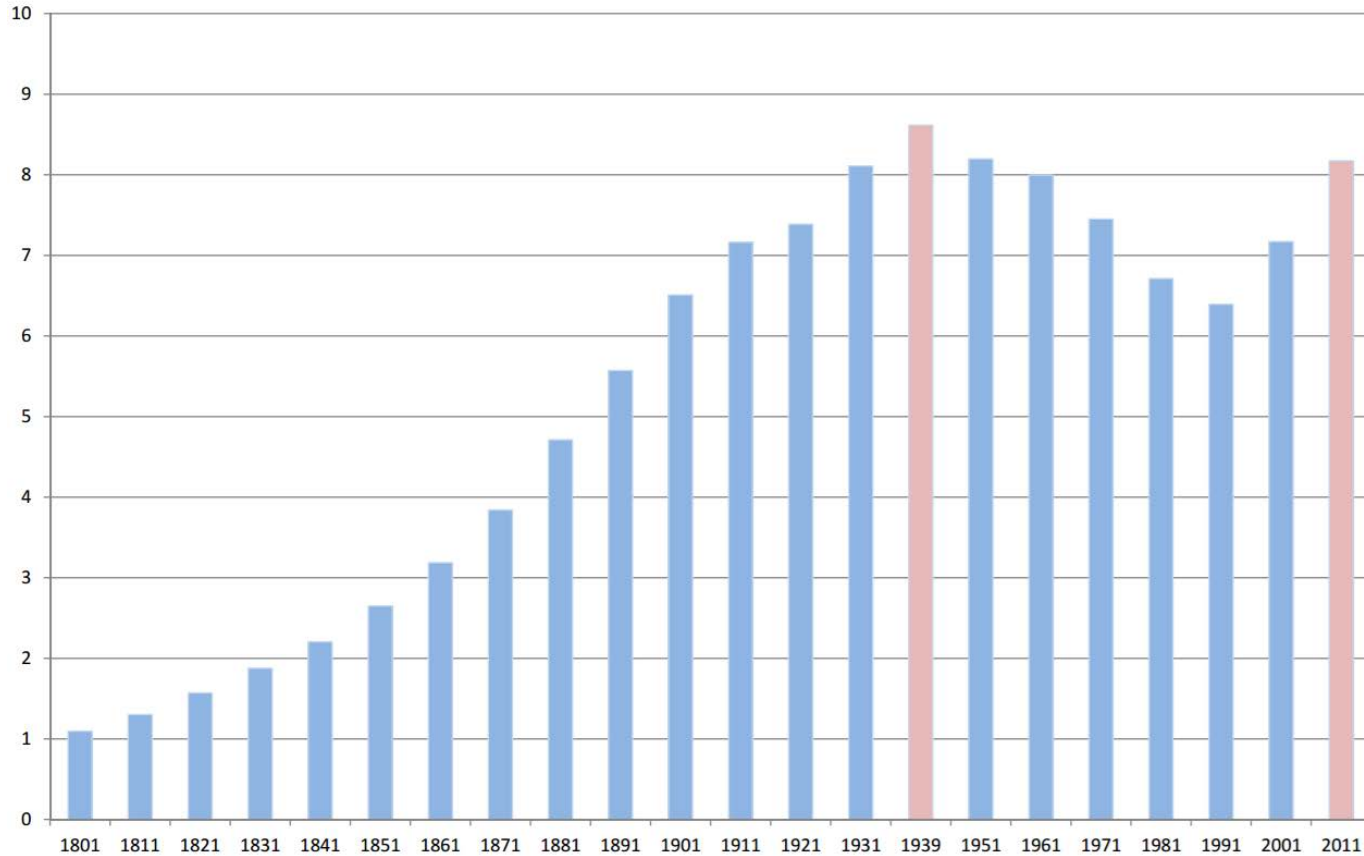

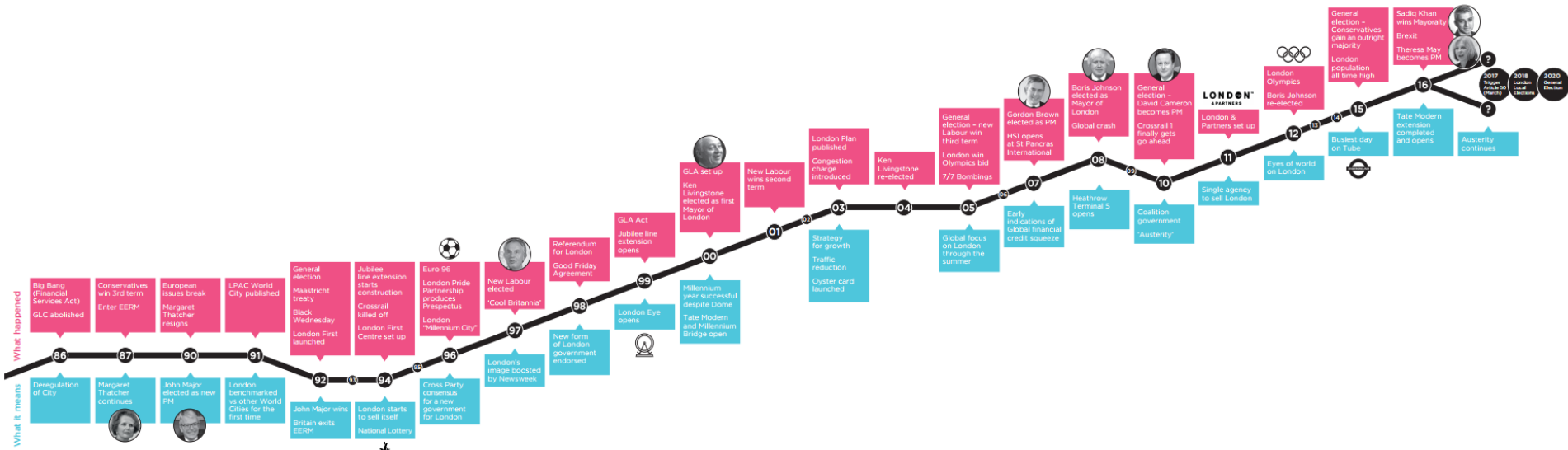

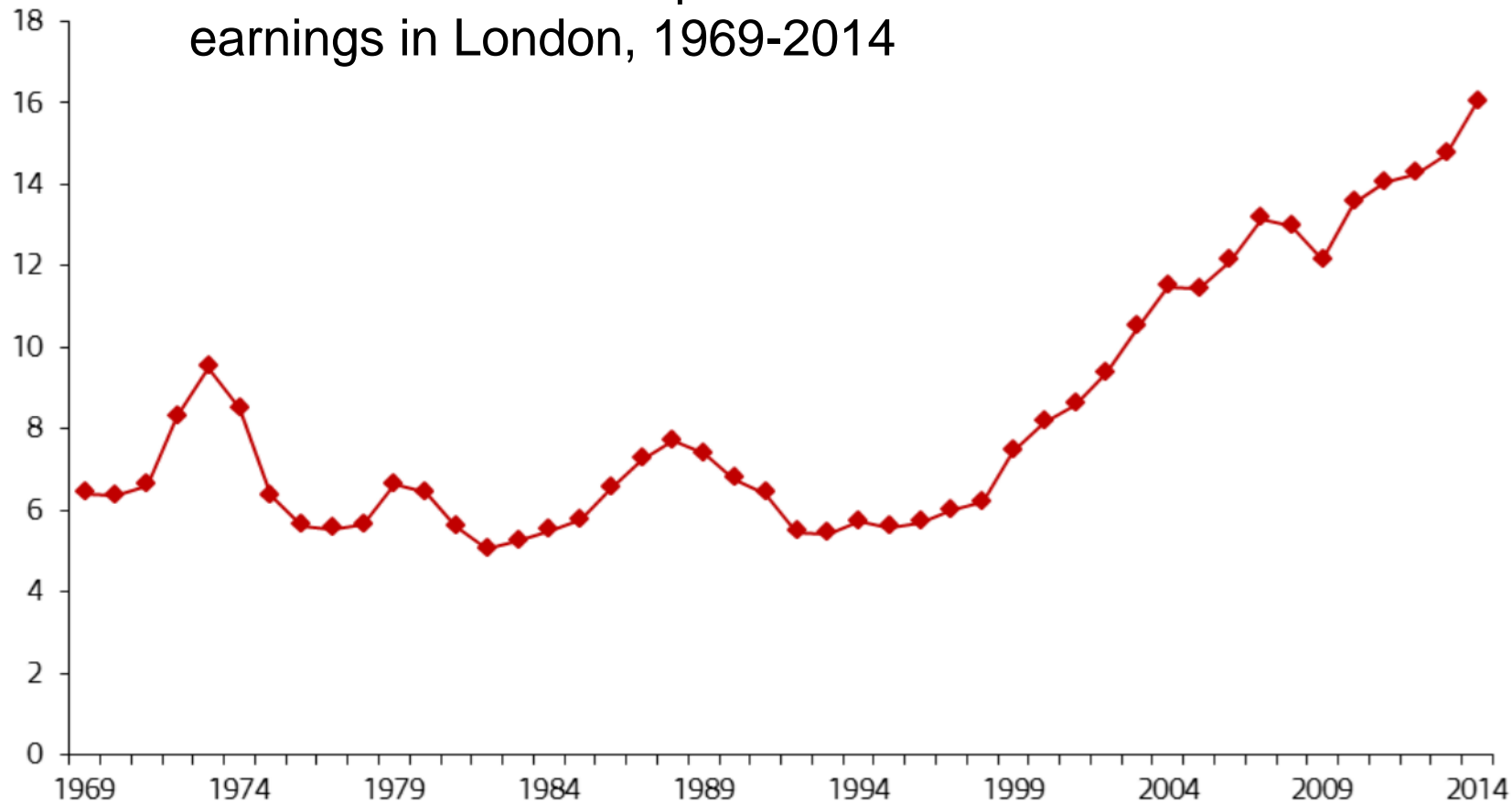

27% had closed services

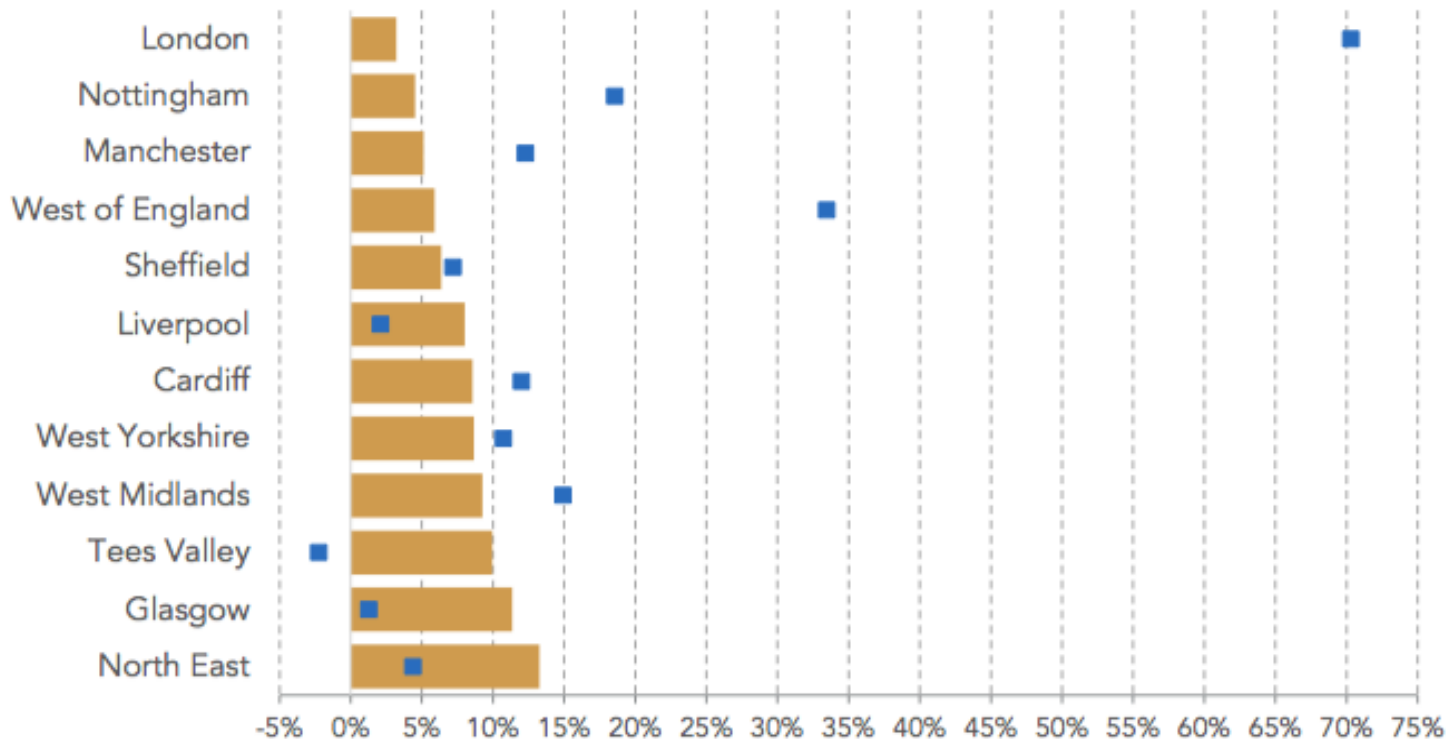
23% expected to close services

Change in earnings and house prices in city regions, 2009-15

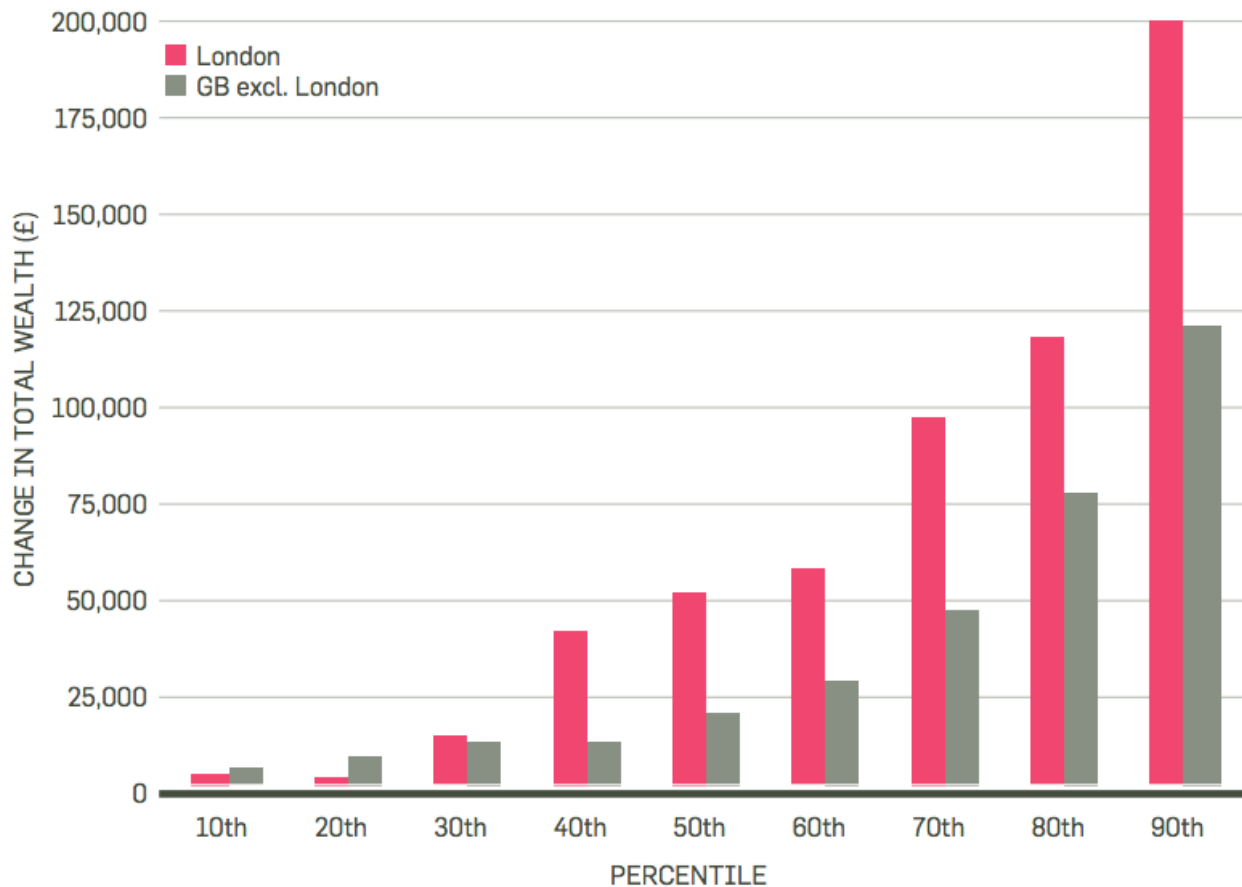
Percentage point change in *median gross weekly earnings* and *house prices* by city regions

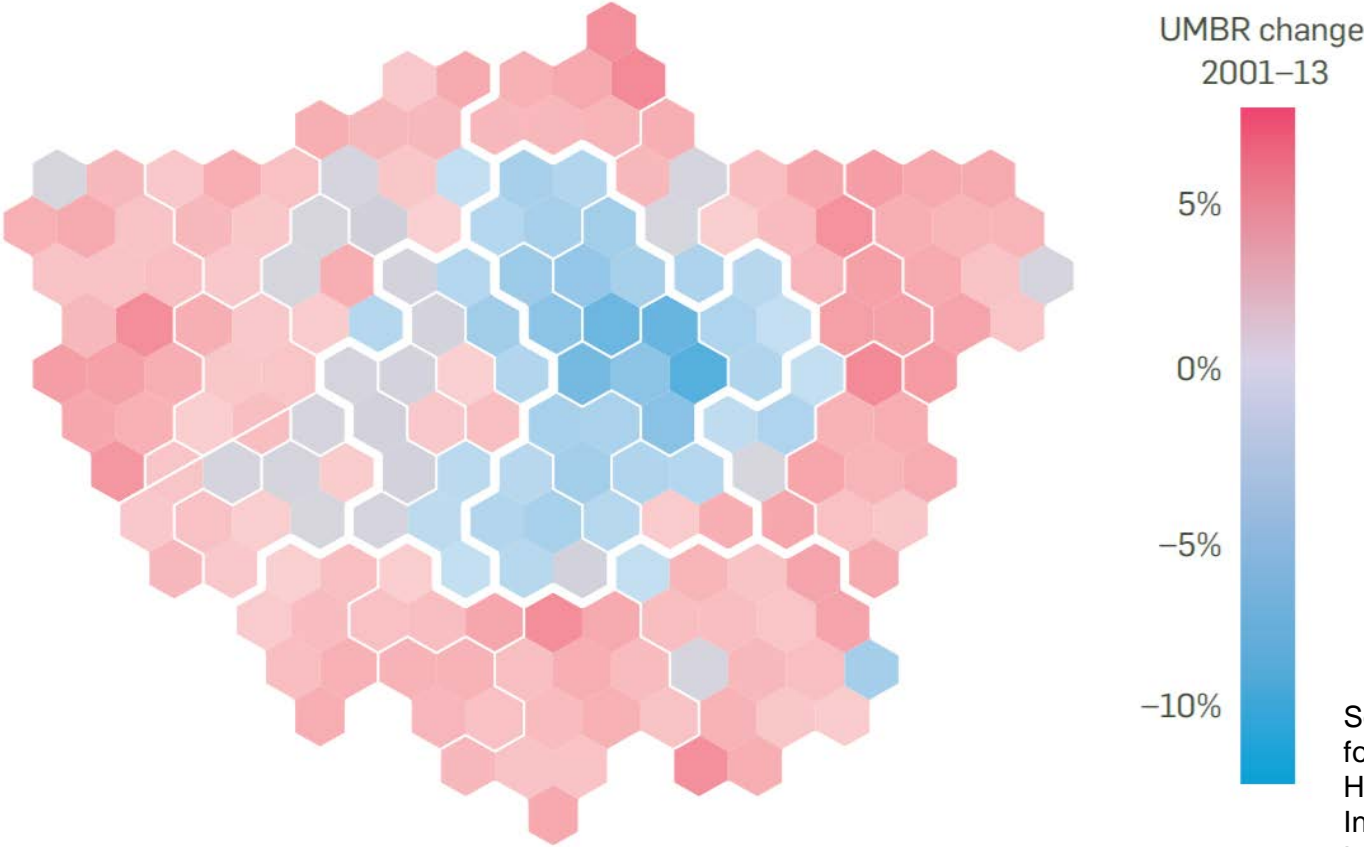
Absolute change in net nominal wealth (£) of households by decile, 2006-12

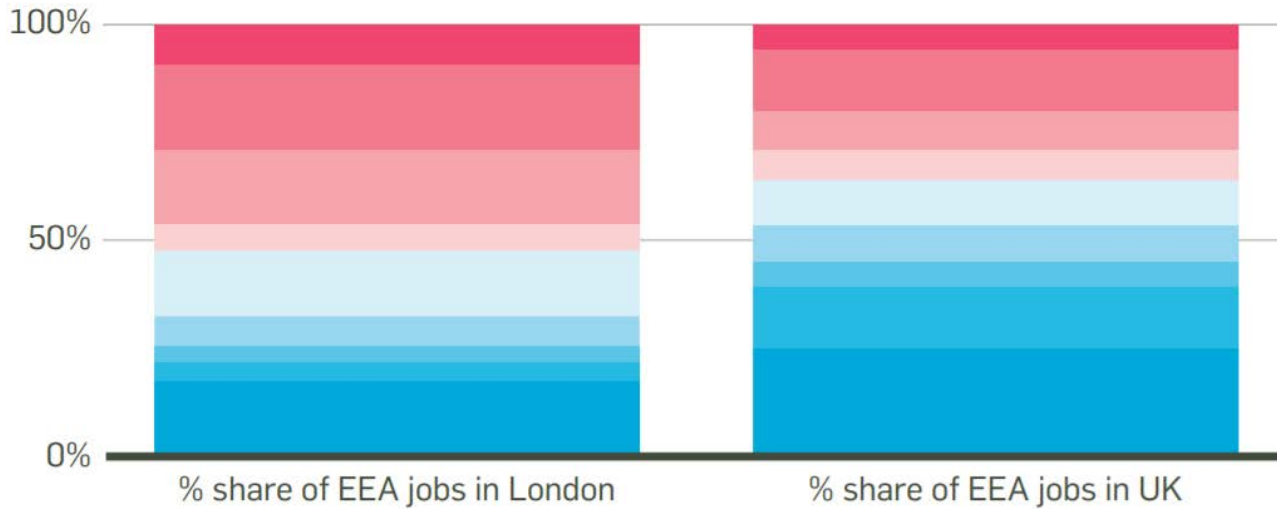

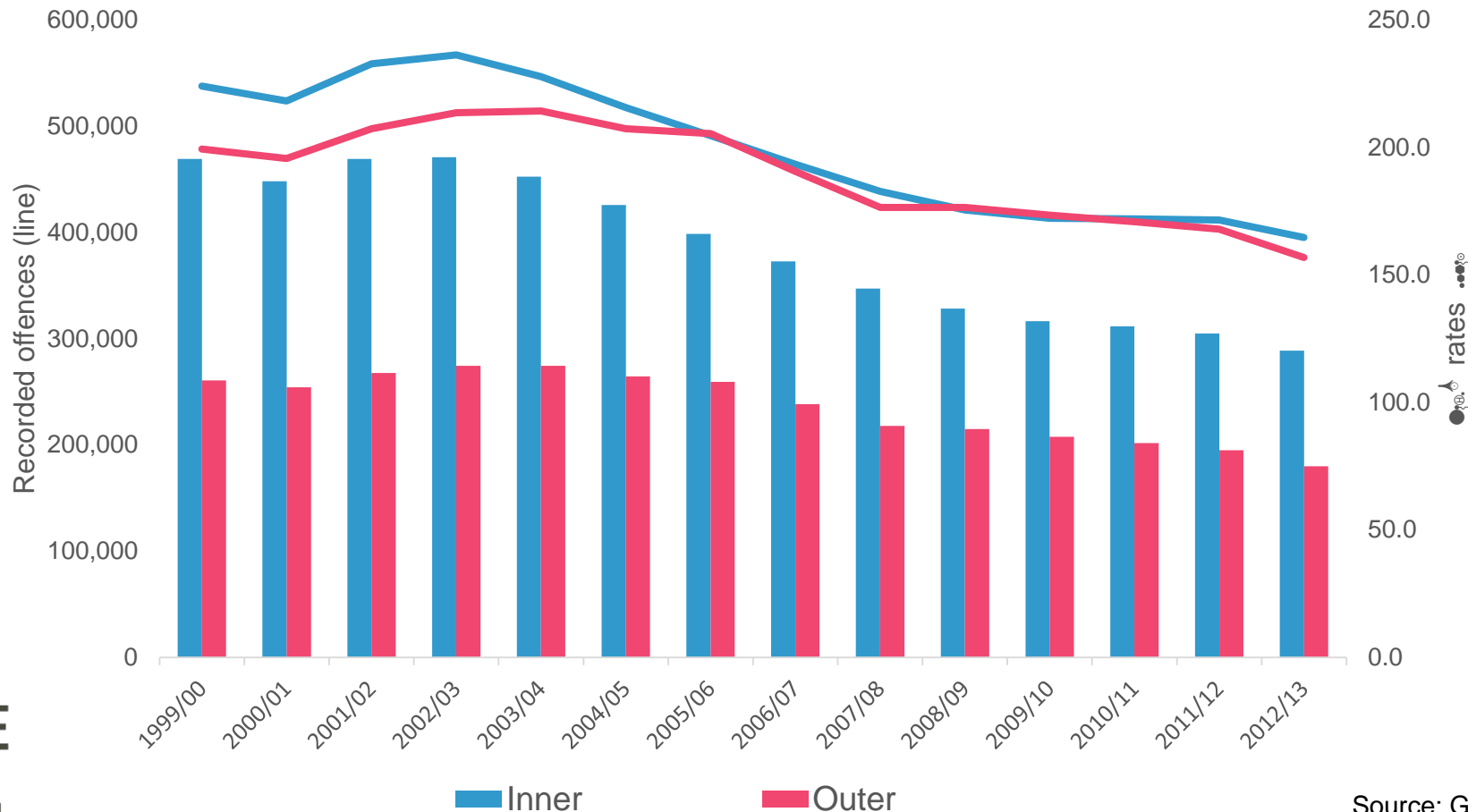

Occupation profile of EEA-born workers in London and UK

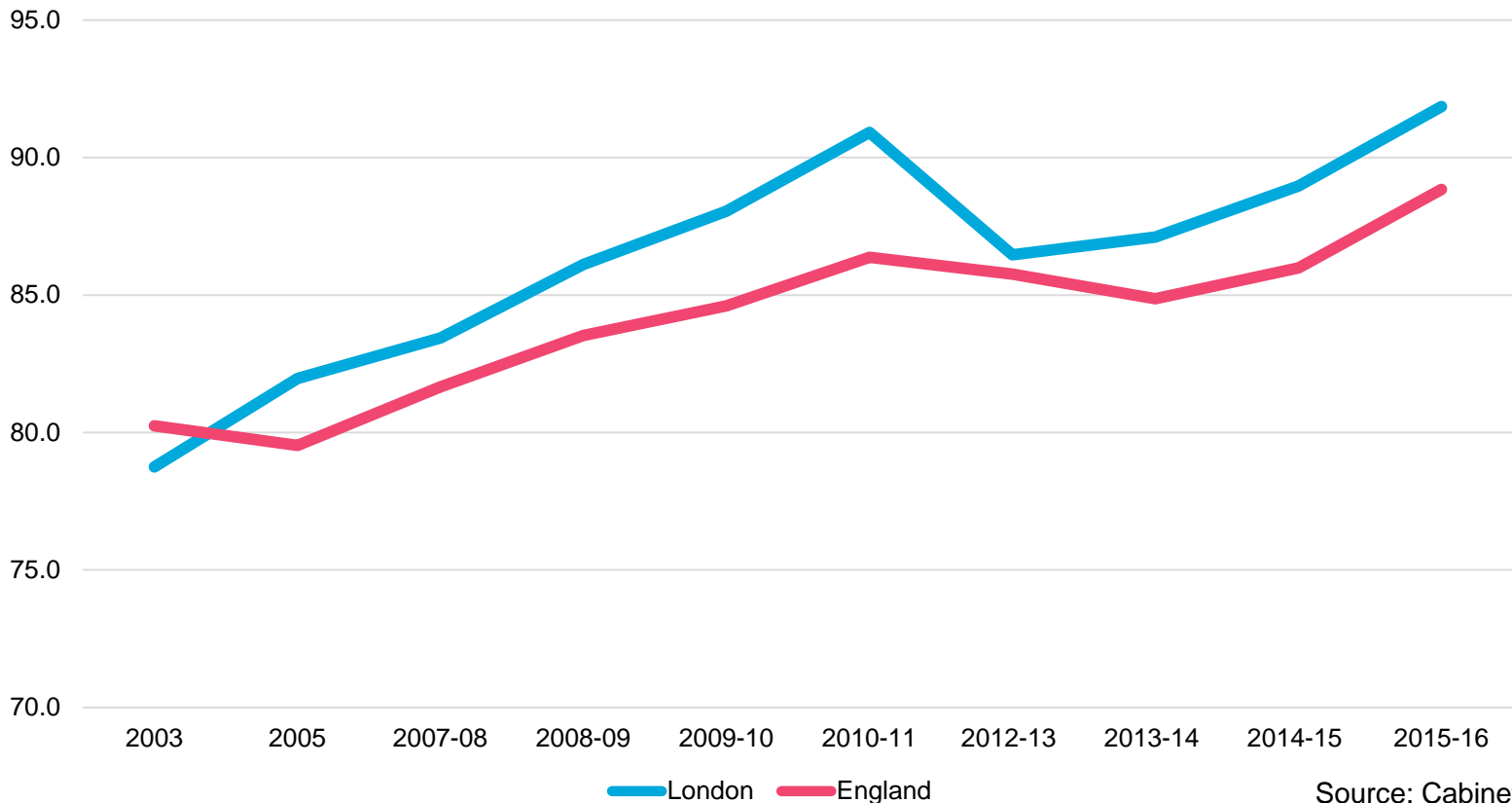

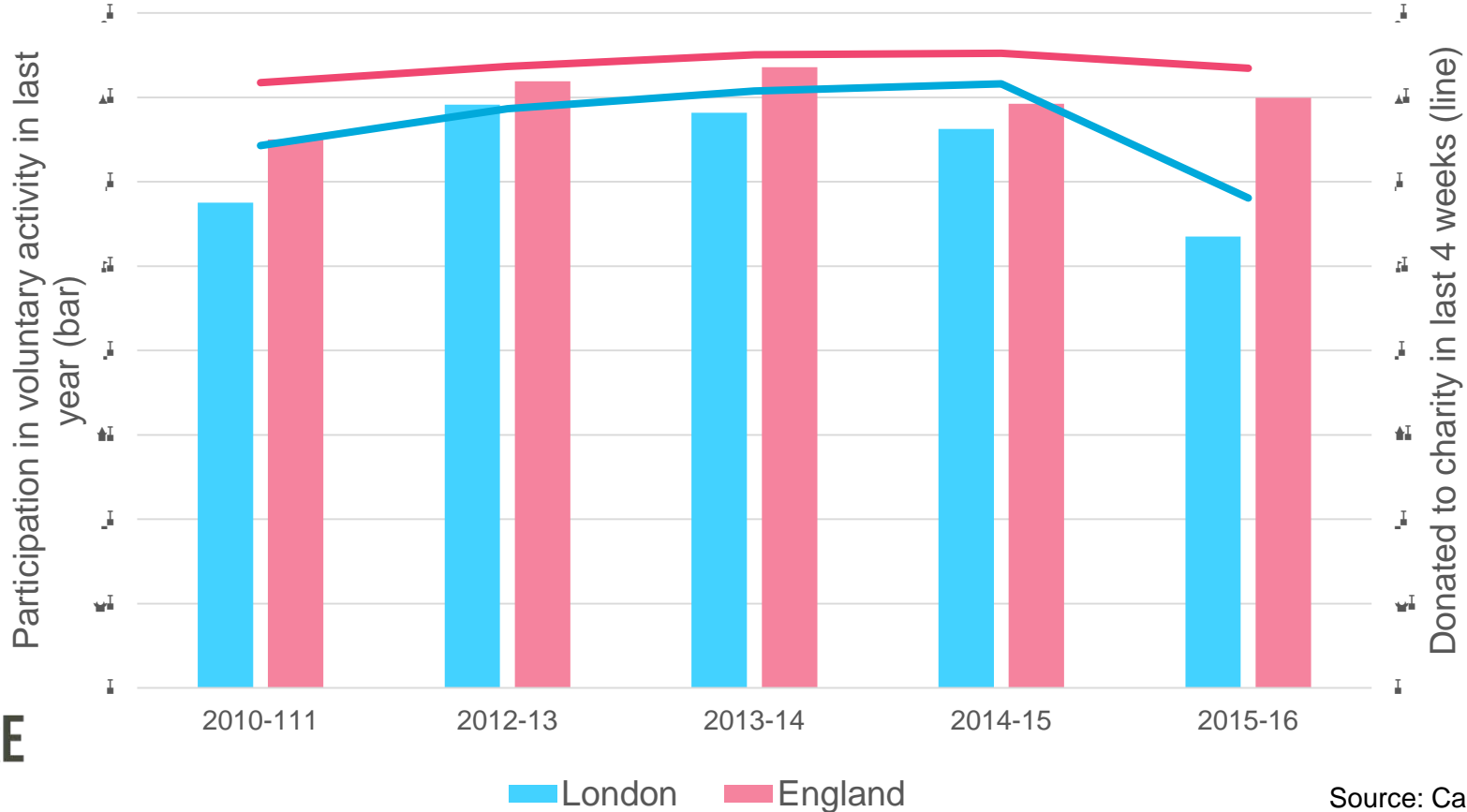
London's recorded offences and crime rates
