ADDRESSING GROWTH CHALLENGES ACROSS THE WIDER SOUTH EAST

The conclusions of the Wider South East Summit 26 January 2018

The importance of continuing to develop collaboration on growth, infrastructure and related strategic planning framework was reiterated by the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, Cllr Nicolas Heslop, Chair of South East England Councils, and Cllr David Finch, Chair of the East of England Infrastructure and Growth Group as well as in contributions from the floor.

The preparation of the new draft London Plan provides an important focus for the current phase of that collaboration. This includes the challenge of meeting housing need across London and the Wider South East, growing the Wider South East's national economic contribution (including local economies), securing infrastructure investment and the opportunity for discussions with willing partners about strategic growth opportunities in the wider city region.

The summit welcomed the work of the political steering group on tackling barriers to housing delivery and strategic infrastructure priorities. It is important that work continues on both topics and that the challenge of securing tighter prioritisation of infrastructure projects is explored further in terms of both the number of priorities and a phased approach to delivering them.

The issues raised during table discussions on the new draft London Plan included:

- The potential for London Boroughs to be more actively engaged in the work of the political steering group, given their role in helping the Mayor deliver against housing targets.
- Calls for a more active approach to stimulating discussions between the GLA and willing partners on strategic growth opportunities and more clarity about the possibilities.
- The importance of London and the Wider South East acting as a counter-weight to arguments from the Northern Powerhouse and Midlands Engine, particularly in relation to infrastructure investment which is essential to enable national economic growth.
- Concerns that there should be an assessment of the London Green Belt to ensure that the
 majority of green belt land is protected while enabling additional residential development
 where appropriate inside London's boundaries.
- The absolute importance of infrastructure investment to support growth aspirations and address public concerns across London and the Wider South East.
- An appetite for more collaboration on digital issues, in particular to help minimising the need to travel.

Key issues raised during table discussions on priorities for Political Steering Group work in 2018 reinforced the need to continue work on ways to address large numbers of unimplemented planning permissions. The Group should also continue work to press for infrastructure investment and consider whether there is capacity to address the challenges around natural resources.










The New London Plan


Tackling housing delivery barriers

Ongoing challenges for South East, East & London. Issues to raise with new Minister & Letwin Review include:

- How to get growing number of unused permissions moving: 40,000+ in East, 67,000+ in South East, 274,000+ in London
- Securing funding for affordable homes
- Funding for infrastructure needed to support new homes
- Action to address shortage of construction skills.

Proposals include new powers so councils can incentivise delivery and raise funds for infrastructure.

Strategic Infrastructure Priorities

- East West Rail and new Expressway road link (Oxford Cambridge)
- 2. North Down Rail Link (Gatwick Reading) including extension to Oxford
- 3. A27 / M27 / A259 and rail corridor (Dover Southampton)
- West Anglia Mainline, Crossrail 2 North (London Stansted Cambridge -Peterborough) and M11
- Great Eastern Mainline (London Ipswich Norwich) and A12
- Essex Thameside, A217 and A13 corridor
- Thames Gateway Kent: Elizabeth Line Extension and HS1 (London North Kent -Channel Tunnel)
- 8. Lower Thames Crossing
- 9. Brighton Mainline (London Gatwick Brighton)
- South West Mainline, Crossrail 2 South West (London Surrey / Southern Rail Access to Heathrow) and A3
- Great Western Mainline (London Reading / Western Rail Access to Heathrow)
- Midlands and West Coast Mainline (London Luton Bedford / Milton Keynes)
- Felixstowe Nuneaton / Midlands and A14
