Q6

Noted on the agreement. We'll add this to the Modifications Schedule for issue to the Inspector.

Qs 12, 13 and 16

Noted, with thanks, on the Inspector's information for the three kinds of spatial application of policies. In light of this, we will make the following modifications and include them within the Modifications Schedule:

- Include policies for Park Road and Old Oak Street within each relevant place policy the streets are present;
- Include policies for the West London Waste Plan sites within each of the relevant place policies and depict these indicatively on the relevant place diagrams;

Q24

The Inspector is correct in the Programme Officer's email dated 03 January 10.55. Table 3.1 and figure 3.17 provide the information requested in Q24 relating to site allocations.

Q25

OPDC's <u>Integrated Water Management Strategy</u> provides the relevant information – specifically sections 4.2.3. and 5.2.1.1 with regards to considering rainwater flow being mitigated through SuDS and section 5.7 with regards to how SuDS will be designed.

Q26

The Old Oak and Park Royal Development Corporation (Planning Functions) Order 2015 sets out information on the draft and adopted borough Local Plans that will continue to have weight. We will include information within the Local Plan as a minor modification confirming that all draft and adopted borough Local Plan policies within the OPDC area will be superseded. Please could you ask the Inspector whether he would be agreeable for this information to be a statement listing all the relevant Local Plans and clearly stating all policies contained within these documents will be superseded? We would prefer this to a list of policies from all the Local Plans which would be lengthy given the number of documents still with weight.

Statements of Common Ground and Issue Statements

We have Statements of Common Ground underway with Historic England (regarding tall buildings), RBKC (regarding Gypsies and Travellers accommodations) and RBKC in relation to the Western Riverside Waste Authority. We are also finalising an Issue Statement with the 3 host boroughs regarding their issues with the affordable housing tenure split. This will provide a final joint statement from the boroughs reiterating their points raised in the consultation and OPDC's response that is based on our response to their consultation points.
